



Even General Custer bought a Life Insurance Policy

General Custer purchased a \$5,000 New York Life Insurance policy on June 4, 1874, about two years before he died at the Battle of the Little Bighorn.

On June 25, 1876, the Oglala Sioux war chief Crazy Horse led the attack by hundreds of Sioux and Cheyenne warriors against Custer's 7th Cavalry, killing Custer and more than 200 of his soldiers.

His wife, Libbie, was the beneficiary of his policy. That policy would be worth about \$500,000 today.
